

## Honors Scholar Project – Proposal Form

This form is used to submit a formal proposal for an Honors Scholar project. To earn Honors Scholar designation, the student must meet all the requirements of the Honors Scholar Project, including:

- Submission of this form by the beginning of senior year (or by the beginning of the second-to-last semester) with all required information complete and accurate.
- The project must be demonstrably interdisciplinary—the project proposal must discuss how the project will utilize research/material from two different academic fields.
- The student and project mentor must meet regularly to review progress.
- The project must be at least 30 pages, typed and double spaced, not including appendices, bibliographies and endnotes.
- The project must be presented at a Temple, regional or national conference.
- The student and mentor must arrange a defense for the project; Honors can help accommodate this if requested.
- A final draft, approved by the mentor and second reader, must be submitted to the Honors Program office by the end of the last week of classes.

To complete this project, students are encouraged to enroll in research methods and independent study courses within their department.
